The storytellers for this year's event will
include:

DAVID BAXLEY, a South Carolina native,
tells stories largely from personal
experience — about himself, friends,
family, and acquaintances.

MILLIE CHAPLIN, South Carolina native,
known as "The Princess of Possum Corner,"
is a versatile storyteller with varied
subjects in her repertoire.

TRAVIS GODLEY, the founder of the
Salkehatchie Storytelling Guild, tells stories
from his many travels, his own
experiences, and tales gleaned from
family.

LARRY A. GROVES is a "musician-
storyteller from East Tennessee way" who
employs drums and a flute in many of his
stories.

HAWK HURST, resident of Charleston,
South Carolina, is a well-traveled
storyteller and Native American-style flute
craftsman/musician whose stories often
feature emphases on indigenous people,
ancient wisdom, and environmental
themes.

BOB LINSENMAYER performs uplifting
stories from a large and diverse repertoire
informed by his travels; Linsenmayer is a
resident of South Carolina who got his
start in the 1960s performing as a folk
artist on the West Coast.

SHIELA MARTINA, native of Walterboro
and the Children's Librarian at Colleton
County Memorial Library, tells stories that
emphasize the positive effects of positive
values.

ANGEE O'CONNELL, originally from
Blythewood, South Carolina, is a "ball of fire
full of stories" known for her animated
delivery of true-to-life tales, whether
speaking as herself or when costumed as
one of her personae.

TONY RHONE is a Walterboro native
whose stories, infused with humor, have a
spiritual and religious bent.
